



# Certificate in Addiction related offences and its Management

(Course code: 15-ADD01)

## Course Aim

This course is an introduction to the basic principles and knowledge of counselling for offenders with addictive behavior. Participants will learn the basics of criminal psychology and the Hong Kong judiciary and correction system. Student will obtain an overview of a broad spectrum of addictive behavior such as substance abuse, pathological gambling, sex addiction and their relationship with criminal offences. Issues regarding etiology, treatment, and relapse prevention of these addictive behaviors will also be addressed.

## Course Objectives

Upon completing the course, participants will be able to demonstrate an understanding of:

- Criminal behavior from different psychological and social perspectives
- Criminogenic risks and needs factor
- Judiciary and correction system in HK
- Major psychobiological principles and processes at work in the phenomenon of addiction
- Different varieties of addictive behavior and its treatment
- Motivational interviewing and relapse prevention strategies

- Counsellors, psychologists, social workers, NGO frontline staff, people with relevant service experiences
- Students and people interested in the topics

In addition to his duties in the general adult psychiatric unit, he also worked in a specialized unit for patients with intellectual disabilities for 6 years before he became the service in-charge of the Substance Abuse Assessment Unit of the Kwai Chung Hospital in 2007. He has started his private practice in Dimensions Center since July 2014.

Dr. Cheung is the Clinical Assistant Professor (Honorary) and part-time Lecturer in the Department of Psychiatry of The Chinese University of Hong Kong since September 2011, supervising students of the Master of Science Programme in Mental Health of the Chinese University of Hong Kong. He also involved in training of the anti-drug workers, and delivered talks on various topics including the health risks of substance abuse, management of insomnia and mood disorders. His publications included topics on youth substance abuse, psychiatric morbidities in people with intellectual disabilities and management of insomnia.

Ms Wong commences her practice as a barrister in Hong Kong since 1998.
